Precious Seed Ministries board members visited the new Church of Daniel and Mary Bear (graduates of our Monterrey Bible School). Randy shared the word in both the morning and evening service. He also met with the ministers of the church and offered to answer questions and open the meeting up for discussion and several people joined in. Randy spoke about relating to Jesus, the Holy Spirit and God Father as someone living inside you as opposed to living far away in heaven. Also Randy encouraged them to remember that God knows your needs. The everyday language of these people is Spanish, but most understand much English. That made it interesting when Randy spoke in English and Wyman translated. Henry was impressed with the dedication the members of the church. Few of the members have walked with the Lord very long, but many came to church for all three services.
