Pandemic, riots in American cities, more than 105,000 deaths in three months, 40,000,000 applications for unemployment, churches closed, people practically locked up in their homes. When the pandemic started the stores were all out of everyday necessities like milk, eggs, bread, toilet paper, diapers and cleaning supplies. Store shelves were completely wiped out. We have been hard at work conducting mobile food distributions



(to minimize contact) of food boxes loaded with said necessities, and delivering the food to the doors of those with no vehicles. In the last 3 three months we have distributed 139,774 pounds of food to 3,411 families including 8,508 adults and 8,704 children. To God be the glory! We also did a diaper and baby wipes distribution to mothers in desperate need of these items when there were none available in local stores. We have made sure to meet the demand while keeping both our clients and volunteers safe. Our volunteers are provided personal protection equipment and we have plenty of disinfecting supplies. Where do we go from here? I can't say exactly what will happen next but I know what we at Precious Seed are going to be doing. We will continue loading food in our vehicles and distributing it to needy families in the Rio Grande valley which, according to authorities, is the most economically depressed area of the state of Texas. We will also continue handing out hot meals in our community, currently serving 150 plates per day. Most importantly we will continue to share the good news and pray for our community.
