

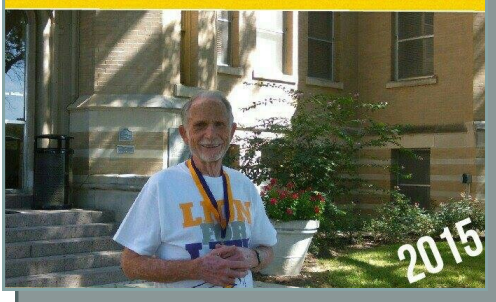
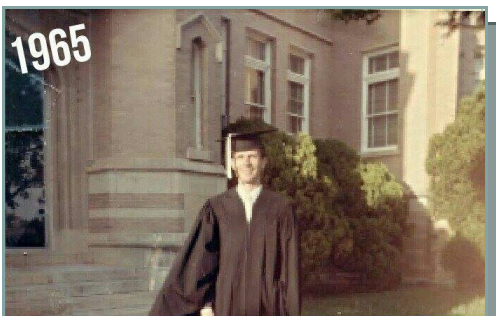

WYMAN & CATHY VISIT SAGU IN WAXAHACHIE

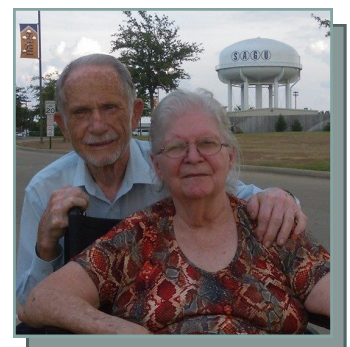

In May those exes paid homage to Cathy and me honoring us for the 48 years of service in Mexico and central America. They expressed their sincere love and gratitude for being the loving parents to them that their natural families had not supplied during those years of their childhood. Representatives of the city of Monterrey as well as the state government were also present to participate in this ceremony of honor. Since that event we have continued to minister to the exes through Facebook and encourage them to be good parents to their children, this is an ongoing ministry to the children of Monterrey. In August we celebrated 50 years of operation of the Bible School, called Instituto Biblico Berea, which is located on the same beautiful campus there just south of Monterrey.

Then in October of this year Cathy and I attended the 2015 homecoming reunion of our school where we were trained, Southwestern Assemblies of God University of Waxahachie TX. We were well received, (see photos below) and it was a joy to meet with many colleagues of 50 years ago. It was also a good time of reflection of how God led and used us these 50 years. I am honored to know that Pastor Greg Thurstonson's and other pastors are setting up a scholarship to help students enroll in the school and naming that fund in my honor. The whole year has been full of looking back celebrating what God has done and inquiring of the Lord as to how he wants to use us from here onward. This question is answered in part by the fact that these ministries continue on.
