SABINAS CHILDREN'S HOME



Ana Laura, Cítlíana, Stephaníe, and Leyver were born in a small rural village in the southern Mexican state of Chiapas. Life is hard in this extreme southern part of Mexico. There is little industry and jobs are hard to get. Most people here live on farming but their farms are very small. Their mother and father were fighting often and eventually the marriage broke up. The father left the mother with four children and ran off with another woman then later he got into trouble and is now in prison. The poor mother had to work at housecleaning on two shifts daily to be able to feed and support her children. She is a Christian who knows how to pray. Her prayers were answered the day she was invited to move with all her children to the Children's Home in Sabínas Hídalgo ín northern Mexíco. It was a long tríp of some two thousand miles but she made it with her four children. She had been accepted as a staff worker in the Sabinas Hidalgo Children's Home and they would accept her children also. She could stay with them and know that they would have a good home.
